2026 City-Wide Clean Up Saturday, April 11th

All items must be curbside by 7 am on this day,
but no earlier than **SEVEN (7) DAYS** prior
Items must fill an area **NO LARGER**
THAN 4'x4'x4'

Small items need to be in **BAGS** or **CONTAINERS**
WOOD must have nails removed
PANELING must be in 4'x4' pieces
BOARDS need to be 4' long or less
CARPET needs to be 4' long or less and be
rolled up and taped
DRYWALL must be in containers & cannot weigh
more than 50-pounds

Cinder Blocks	Dirt	Mulch


Refuse pick-up is for CITY RESIDENTS ONLY. A fine will be charged if rubbish from outside of the City is found being brought into the City.

The City of Hudson Office will be closing at Noon on Friday, April 3rd in observation of Good Friday and Easter Weekend



Ordinance No. 379-08 states that no person occupying any premises or lot, and no person owning any unoccupied premises or vacant lot shall permit or maintain on any such premises any growth of noxious weeds regardless of height, or any growth of grass or other vegetation that has attained a height of 8 inches or more.

If this ordinance is not complied with, the City Manager may cause such noxious weeds, grass, or other vegetation to be removed or destroyed, and the greater of \$120.00 or the actual cost of such cutting, removal or destruction, plus an administrative fee, and other costs in connection therewith, shall be collected from the owner as a special assessment against the premises.

The City of Hudson also reminds residents and lawn care professionals that the blowing of grass clippings into the street is prohibited. The clippings can clog the storm drains and may contribute to street flooding when heavy rains occur. Clippings should be bagged or mulched. The Department of Public Works will pick up yard debris that has been placed in paper biodegradable bags, and brush cut in 4 ft. lengths at the curbside as time permits on Mondays between 7:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. as needed throughout the summer.


The City of Hudson will have **3 three-year Council Seats open this November 2026 Election!**

NE Corner - Week of March 23 to March 27
SE Corner - Week of March 30 to April 3
NW Corner - Week of April 6 to April 10
SW Corner - Week of April 6 to April 10
