Please be sure that we receive your Utility payment in the office by the deadline to avoid late charges. Please make sure the I-Pay accounts arrive on or before the due date. Once an account receives a shut-off notice, the account **MUST** be paid in full prior to the scheduled shut-off date to avoid the shut-off plus additional charges.

LEAF PICK-UP SCHEDULE

Leaves raked to the curb in your area will be picked up in accordance with the schedule. ***Please keep the leaves out of the street.*** Please, ***no twigs or branches*** should be mixed with the leaves, as it is hazardous to both man and machine. Once the schedule has been completed, areas will be revisited and picked up as time permits.

City-Wide Clean-Up

Fall clean-up is **Saturday, October 18th**. All items for general pick-up must be curbside by 7:00 a.m. on this day but no earlier than **seven (7) days** before the pick-up date.

Items that **CANNOT** be disposed of on this day are:

- vehicle tires
- refrigerators (without a CFC sticker & door removed)
- batteries
- paint or stain cans, liquids of any type
- large auto parts
- fluorescent bulbs
- bricks, concrete, or cement blocks.

Please remember that if articles are placed at the curb after your street has been picked up, the crews will not return to that particular street, and items should be removed from the curbside by 7:00 a.m. the following morning. **Refuse pick-up is for City of Hudson residents only. A fine will be charged if rubbish from outside of the City is found being brought into the City.**

SNOW, SNOW, SNOW

Everyone who has a sidewalk will have 12 hours to clear them of snow and ice after cessation. State of Michigan prohibits anyone to deposit any snow, ice, or slush onto any roadway or highway.

There will be a **General Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014**. Residents of the City of Hudson will be voting at the fire station addition between the hours of 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. Absentee ballots are available until Saturday, November 1, 2014.

The City Office will be open from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. on November 1st in the event you need to request an absentee ballot.

The last day to register to vote in the November General Election is October 6, 2014. You may register at the Secretary of States Office, or by bringing your photo identification to the Hudson City Clerk's Office.

Please keep in mind that prior to voting at the polls, you must be able to provide the election inspector proper photo identification. In most cases a driver's license will work. If you do not have a driver's license, please contact Jeaniene McClellan at 517-448-8983 for additional types of approved photo identification.
